

Oak Valley Health declares outbreak of COVID-19 at Markham Stouffville Hospital, 2C Transitional Care Inpatient Unit

September 9, 2022

Today, in consultation with York Region Public Health, an outbreak has been declared at Markham Stouffville Hospital on 2 Centre (2C), Transitional Care Inpatient Unit. An outbreak, as defined by the Ministry of Health, is two or more laboratory-confirmed COVID-19 cases (patients and/or staff) within a specified area (unit/floor/service) within a 10-day period where both cases could have reasonably acquired their infection in the hospital.

Four patients have tested positive in connection with this outbreak. All four patients are in the appropriate isolation and are being monitored closely.

During this seventh wave of the pandemic, Oak Valley Health remains vigilant.

As part of our outbreak management measures, we are conducting testing of patients and staff on the unit in accordance with public health guidance and have heightened infection prevention and control measures such as enhanced cleaning of the unit and equipment, and ongoing auditing and reinforcement of personal protective equipment (PPE) practices. . The unit is currently closed to all visitors.

The health and safety of our patients, the community and our health care workers is paramount. The Infection Prevention and Control team at Oak Valley Health is working closely with York Region Public Health to ensure that appropriate outbreak control measures are in place.
